- Gertrude Hawk fundraiser is finished but our actual profit is not finalized yet due to waiting for online order information. Our total profit as of now is \$5572 which is over our budgeted profit. This is 24% less than last year due to loss of students to the new elementary school.
- Our profit from Race for Education was \$27,000. We have no other large fundraisers this year.
- We have approved almost \$1200 in expenses so far this year.

- 3. Bulldog store could use a second cash register to speed up the checkout process. A motion to approve \$85.00 for a cash register was made by Jenni Gery. Second: Nikki Heckard. All in favor.
- 4. There are many upcoming activities for which we need volunteers: Sign up online to donate food for the teachers during upcoming conferences. Holiday shop starts Dec. 3 and runs for the entire week. Much help is needed. For next year, we will have openings on the board for Treasurer and Vice President. Dec. 7 volunteers are needed at Barnes & Noble night. Jan 2 & 3 volunteers are needed to help with the hands on STEAM traveling museum.
